Commemorating the Michaelmas Festival together with other people: why not come together worldwide at the same time – and thus be united in one great community? The idea came to me when my husband called our sons, who live in different time zones, together for a video call at a time that suited us all and when we were all still awake. Why not try the same for the Michaelmas Festival? Admittedly, it's not possible to find a time when it's still daytime for everyone in the world... So I looked through the time zones and settled on Tuesday 29 September at 2 pm German time. It will be the same time in Johannesburg as well as in Germany, 2 pm, in New York it will then be 8 am, in Tokyo 9 pm, in Sydney 10 pm, in London 1 pm, in New Delhi 6 pm, and so on. On the anthroposophical website of Goslar, „Michaeli 2026“ (<https://anthroposophie-goslar.de/michaeli/>), there is a map showing the world's time zones, so that anyone who wishes to take part can synchronise their local time with Germany's 2 pm. If as many people as possible are made aware of the event and share the link to the website, we would truly be connected worldwide – through meditation or simply by thinking of the human community and Michael.
